SAFETY REMINDER

Starting the New Year Right

Some of you know that my wife, my dog and I recently moved. On the whole it is a great move for us, but we have to build out space for my shop, so almost all my tools are in storage. ③

My oldest grandson is about to turn 6. For that last few years I have tried to make him wooden playthings. I try to make playthings that require skill to use, and that mostly show natural wood colors and textures. I figure since most of his toys are brightly colored, texture less plastic, I should expose him to how real wood feels and smells. Who knows, maybe someday he will become a woodworker?

He has now been joined by three other grandchildren, so of course I make something for each of them. Not having a shop this year required me to think carefully about what I could make with the tools I have available. Through a shop storage mistake my scroll saw didn't get stored with my other tools, so I decided I would make puzzles. I also have a benchtop drill press that I used to spin drum sanders and sanding mops to take the splintery bits off the puzzle pieces.

I've made puzzles for grandkids several times. I ask the kids' parents what kinds of things the kids like, then browse the internet looking for reasonably simple cartoons and drawings that might translate well into puzzles. This year I was told the grandkids are (oldest first) into lions, monkeys and dogs. The one-year old didn't express a preference so I made him a three piece puzzle of a smiley face.

I like to use different thicknesses of wood to give the puzzles a slightly three-dimensional



appearance, kind of like rudimentary intersia pictures. I find Pinterest to be hugely helpful in finding images that I can use for puzzles, and for lots of other projects. If you are curious, this link will show you the images


Christmas gifts need to be done by Christmas. Old Saint Nick ain't gonna delay the holiday just so the oil on my puzzles can dry.

In spite of promising myself to do better, every year I end up rushing around and cutting corners so I can get the gifts done on time.

One of the first corners I cut is my tidiness corner. I leave tools on my small work surface instead of putting them away. If they won't fit on the surface on the floor right where I am likely to need to stand. When pieces of wood fall to the floor I don't pick them up unless I need them immediately. If I have to connect another tool to the power strip I just push the cord through the tangle of other cords. Late in the gift making stage I end up moving around on tippy toe so I don't trip on cords or pieces of wood or bang my ankles on the tool stands.

Late in the Christmas gift making process my shop is not a pretty sight, and, in case you are wondering, cutting the tidiness corner is NOT a wise strategy. It's actually a dangerous, stupid strategy. It's dangerous, because it increases the risk that I will injure myself. It is stupid because it makes me spend so much extra time rooting through the piles of stuff that I keep cramming onto my one small work surface.

This is a dangerous, stupid way to behave, and I have made a solemn New Year's resolution not to do it again. But I can't put that resolution into effect now because my next gift making deadline is still some time away.



Lucky you.

There is, however, one thing I can do now.

I can clean up the mess I made making Christmas gifts.

I'm sure none of you would ever make such a mess to begin with, and if you ever did you would clean it up right away.

So you don't need me to noodge you to put your tools away, to get the cr@p off your floor, to throw out the small bits of wood you will never use, to organize the cords to your power tools so you don't have to step over them, and to figure out where you are going to store your tools and supplies so you can actually find them when you need them. Me, I still have to go face the mess in this picture. I have to throw out lovely little pieces of useless wood because I don't have room to store them (sob!). I have to figure out where to locate my scroll saw and drill press so I don't trip over their cords, and hardest of all, I have to figure out what to keep on my small work surface and where to put the rest of my small tools.

I've made a solemn vow to start doing that soon. Real soon... \Box


