SAFETY REMINDER

Please Postpone Your Woodturning Injuries!

Happy New Year! It is finally 2021, vaccines for COVID-19 have been approved, and Cascade Woodturners should be meeting again in person by January 2022.

In recognition of this very special time I'm changing my usual approach. Instead of hectoring you to avoid injuring yourself while you are woodturning, like I usually do, I'm merely pleading with you to postpone all your 2021 woodturning injuries until at least this Fall.

Here's why: although coronavirus vaccines have been approved, it likely will be months before they are widely administered and effective. To make matters worse, people are getting really tired of taking precautions and a new, more communicable strain of the virus is making its rounds, so things are predicted to get significantly worse before they start to get better.

Now imagine, if you can, that you *really want* to spend time with people who have coronavirus. Where would you go? You would go to a medical facility, of course, because that's where people go when they think they have coronavirus.

Unfortunately, that is also exactly where you need to go if you injure yourself woodturning. If you want to avoid unnecessary exposure to coronavirus, you should avoid unnecessary visits to medical facilities, at least until you have been vaccinated and are protected, or until the coronavirus vaccine is so widely administered that herd immunity has kicked in. I don't know when that will be, but I'm currently betting it will be the Fall of 2021.

So I'm asking you: please, *please*, postpone all your woodturning injuries for 2021 until at least this Fall.

Of course, the only way you can postpone your woodturning injuries from this Winter, Spring and Summer into this Fall is to practice safe woodturning. There are oodles of things you can do to make woodturning safer; so many that people have written years of monthly safety articles and wiser people have even written books about them. In fact, the AAW has a couple of woodturning safety books:



Just go to woodturner.org, log in, search for "safety" and you will get links to download them.

Reading one or both of these books would be a great way to help pass the idle hours inside while the pandemic rages outside.

Books and articles will give you specifics. But it is also useful to have a simple, basic principle that can guide all your woodturning activities. Here is my favorite basic woodturning safety principle. At least until this Fall, please recite it to yourself every time you go out into your shop and approach your lathe, table saw, band saw, or other item of flesh eating or bone crushing equipment:
