The AAW's 501(c)(3) status allows us to receive tax-deductible donations from individuals, as well as certain corporation, foundation and government funding, and to qualify for exemptions from some taxes and fees that AAW would otherwise have to pay. The AAW has been granted new 501(c)(3) status as a new corporation in the state of Minnesota. The IRS expedited our request and on January 13, 2012, approved the new corporation's 501(c)(3) nonprofit status dating from November 14, 2011. Minnesota requires that AAW membership vote to approve a merger of the existing AAW into the new AAW corporation. In order to complete this process, we will be asking all AAW members to vote in favor of this action no later than February 23rd, 2012. All members should have received either a paper ballot or an electronic ballot by e-mail. Please remember to vote.

Remember to save the date of June 8-10 to be in San Jose, CA for the AAW 26th annual international symposium, this is the closest it will be to this area for another 5 years. The AAW web site has a FOUR page listing of the planned demonstration subjects.

There were no entries as a challenge contestant in the January show'n'tell. There were a number of lovely turnings to admire as these turnings show.









JANUARY DEMO

Gary Sundquist showed how to design a hollow vessel with legs for a base that flow out of the design form. The legs flow from designs that the turner lays out on the vessel blank and then are carved to have a smooth transition into the base. The base is then carved to let the legs remain.

He also discussed utilizing natural features of the wood to be a focal point of the turning. Gary orients his pieces to permit the feature to be the object of interest. This takes adjusting the turning such that it may be off center for roughing and may require relocating centers after an initial cut reveals an interesting void, inclusion or grain pattern. The examples Gary brought were food for thought.







LIBRARY CORNER

Here is some food for thought about our library. As your newsletter editor, I often visit other AAW Chapter's web sites to see what other newsletters look like. I have found that many clubs differ from our club in two significant ways, the size of their libraries and access to library items. Cascade Woodturners has a sizeable library, larger than most I have viewed. For the size of our club and the fact that we have more than one club in a close geographical area, we enjoy a great resource in the library.

The other significant difference from many clubs is that the library is free to members. A lot of clubs charge either a rental fee of \$0.50 to \$2.00 per item. Each month that the item is held out is an additional rental fee. Those that do not charged a rental fees do charge a fine for items held out beyond the next meeting date.

We need to appreciate not only the access we have to a well managed and adequate library but to let out librarians know what a fine job they are doing. Dawn McClard and Mike Worthington do a lot for the club and we thank you.

COMING ATTRACTIONS

Cascade Woodturners:

Bill Moore, will demonstrate at our March meeting on the 15th. He will be showing us how to make shapes from wood that were first made from clay by the potter Hans Cooper. These will be non-symmetrical shapes made on the lathe.

April 19th meeting will have Dave Schweitzer showing us how he makes his wooden long necked hollowed bottles. Dave is known by most of us for his excellent tools from D-Way Tools, but in addition he is a very talented turner, teacher and demonstrator.

April 20th will have Dave teaching a hands on for up to six people on the design and making of hollow forms. He will cover the layout and carving of flutes as well as the design and making of finals to top the hollow forms. Dave makes some of the prettiest finals I have ever seen, and is capable of bringing you from someone who admires finials to someone who makes them. If there is time he will also help us to make the off center designs he adds to bowls and platters. This hands on will be at Dale's shop and there will be a \$90.00 charge for taking the class.

Saturday April 21st there will be an all day demonstration at Dale's by Dave Schweitzer on the various pieces he makes. There is a \$30.00 charge for this all day demo. In addition to other things we should be able to get him to show us how to use his beading tools and then Dale won't be the only one who can make beads on his bowls.
