February challenge winner was Joe Escriva with a hollowed vessel, 3-5/8" X 12-1/8 of Madrone, with top and base of Ebony, the stopper (lack of better wording) is Maple compressed between thin pieces of Ebony, cut and formed. The vessel dyed with was an Aniline dye, the symbol is oriental meaning "Out of Chaos, where dreams begin", was added with black shoe polish. Then 8-9 coats lacquer, finished with a Beall's 3 step buffing. Very nice.

TIP OF THE MONTH

With Andi Wolfe coming to demonstrate, I got thinking about surface enhancements. Something I am interested in but, I needed a new tool for my shop to embark on the path of marking my turnings. I had seen articles on Graham Priddle's wood vaporizer and decided that I really needed a woodburner that can smoke out my shop faster than my beagle can get in trouble with a skunk.

The original idea was that I had a battery charger and should modify it so I could use it for woodburning. Well my charger was really old; I think I got it about 25 years ago. I found out you need a MANUAL charger with no electronics. As old as mine was, it still was an automatic charger. I had looked for a manual type at garage sales but none around here. I went to Sears and bought a new one. NAPA or Harbor Freight also has manual chargers and all of them are in the \$40 range.

All it took was a 600watt light dimmer, some jack ends from Radio Shack and a Burnmaster interchangeable tip woodburner and I was headed to make smoke, well almost.



I also tried a ready made cord from Radio Shack and couldn't get the tip to heat up. The cord got warm enough to make a great hand warmer on a cold night but used up too many watts before the power got to the tip. Using the left over battery charger wire and more tips from the Shack, I now can turn the tip bright cherry red in milliseconds. I had the rheostat turned up too high when I plugged it in and almost melted the tip. The charger has a 2 amp and a 10 amp setting, the 2 amp is plenty.

The dimmer is wired in series on the 120v input line and the jacks are the terminal points of the 12v output to the burner tip. I added a toggle switch for a positive on/off ahead of the dimmer, just because I like to really know it is turned off.

If I had been a bitten by a bigger DIY bug, I could have made the woodburner tip too. A number of fans of this set up make their own tips using ni-chrome wire and silver solder. The burner handle can be wood or plastic pipe with more Radio Shack connectors. Another option is to make the dimmer and plugs in a separate box and attach your charger with the existing battery charging leads to a pair of large terminals. This way you can still use the charger for charging your 12 volt batteries. I wanted something more portable.
