DALE'S CORNER

\$35 for 35 demonstration. I want to thank everyone who helped out with my \$35 for 35 project. This is my 35th year of woodturning and I wanted to mark it with something special. I combined it with my role in the AAW. I have traveled around the US and abroad teaching woodturning but had never done an all day demonstration here in the Portland area. I originally planned on doing one day but added a second day when the sign up reached capacity of my shop. On Friday we had 25 turners here and on Saturday 18 turners. I started with a slide show of how to take a tree down and cut up the tree. Then I roughed out a bowl showing how to manipulate the grain to get the best pattern in the finished bowl. We talked about how to dry the bowl blank and different methods of drying wood. I then finished turned a madrone bowl showing tool usage and talked about sanding. Members got to see how I make a bowl starting with the tree clear through the finished bowl. Next came a thin bowl turned from wet madrone to less than 1mm showing how to use light as a thickness caliper. Friday I went through the bottom when I reverse turned it. Darn, the first mistake of my life. Next came turning spheres by eye showing how to use cup chucks and jam chucks. I finished up with a demonstration on how the oval chuck works. We finished the day by raffling off all the demo pieces and a few roughed out bowls. We raised \$2308 for AAW. Thank you to everyone that contributed. And thanks to Pete Gibson and Howard Borer for all their help.



LIBRARY CORNER

There have been a number of video additions to the library. A number of the new videos are from the Utah Association of Woodturners club and are their meeting demos. Sometimes the sound is challenging to hear with background noise but the subjects are interesting and the turning techniques useful. The cost to the club was \$8.50 per video. New titles include "Spheres" by Mike Hyer, "Kids Play Kaleidoscopes" by Loren Gibbs, "Corrion Pendants" by Bruce Bassett, "Halloween Ornaments" by Dave Best, "Nested

Madrone Bowl Set" by Mike Mahoney, "Gettin' The Scoop" by Joe Wagner, "Seam Ripper" by Stuart Davey and "Spoon Foot Legs" by Tom Sorensen. These videos are a good way to see typical club members doing a demo for their club. You too can demo for Cascade, think about it and volunteer to show how you turn.

The demo by Mike Jackofsky at the Utah Symposium was very informative with all his techniques explained on turning hollow forms with small openings. The double disc video "Making A Hollow Vessel" follows his demo with even more added detail. We have his video in the library also.

BOND SOLUTION

Gluing oily wood can be a problem. The usual glues often fail when used with teak, Cocobolo and other oily or highly resinous woods. The Smith & Co makes an epoxy specifically formulated to solve this problem. Take a look at their website for details, http://www.glueoakandteak.com.

HOW TO BE BUFF

The last thing I usually do is buff my turnings with a three wheel buffing system. Mine is from Don Pencil but it is very similar to the Beall system. The following videos from You-Tube take you through the steps to successfully polish your turning. 


