GOOD WOOD WEBSITES

This month's wood web site is a demo of a Ringmaster to make a stacked ring Cherry vase. You can view it on http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=B8_RQGcxQZw. Stacked ring turnings are a good way to put your toe into the water of segmented turning. This video uses the somewhat expensive Ringmaster to produce the rings. It is an interesting and well filmed video but there are many less expensive ways to produce the ring components; band sawing half rings, scroll sawing whole rings and simply cutting the rings with a thin parting tool on the lathe. Look at the video and see if you have the urge to try one. Back "in the day" a well known turner that now concentrates on gallery grade Madrone bowls even made stacked ring turnings.
